2011, A RECORD YEAR!

2011 was full of records for the Morris County Swim Club. Coach Al gave out MCSC "Record" pins like they were candy this past year. Back in the first few months of the year, Roo Fenton held the fastest time in the USA for a M9 year old LC 50 freestyle. In August, Brian Stiles set a meet record at LC Zones as he swam to an All American cut time. Carolyn Silverman followed up in December with the 1st MCSC Women's All American cut. The MCSC already has 400+ Silver or better times as we ended 2011, by far more than any other season. 21 swimmers have Gold Times that qualify them for the [NJ Swimming Junior Olympics Championship Meet](#). The 10& U boys set 4 NJ Swimming Records. All in all, a record year for the MCSC.



Aidan Hughes, Vinny Marciano, Adrian Massuet and Roo Fenton set two [NJ Swimming Relay Records](#) at the 25th Holiday Classic Swim Meet held at Rutgers University December 9-11. Marciano also grabbed the NJ Swimming Record in the 50 Freestyle and Roo Fenton grabbed the NJ Swimming Record in the 50 Butterfly. These are the first NJ Swimming records, but not the last, held by MCSC swimmers. These records may last a week or 30 years, but they'll always be a reflection of the dedication and hard work by all of the swimmers and coaches of the Morris County Swim Club.

ALL AMERICAN TIMES

Carolyn Silverman became the youngest MCSC swimmer to capture a prestigious All American cut time, swimming the SC 100 Backstroke in a blazing 0:58.94 at the [Holiday Classic Meet](#) at Rutgers in December. Our oldest year-rounder, Brian Stiles set the [Eastern LC Zone 100 Free Record](#) in an All American 0:53.35 in August at Penn State.

Danielle Silverman, Danielle Curtis and Ava Curry set [MCSC Long Course 8&U records](#) during the summer. In the 9-10 age group Laurel Carey hoarded 6 LC records, with Adian Pinto also picking up 3. They matched Roo Fenton's 9 LC records. On the boys side, Aidiran Massuet also gathered in 2 records. Jocelyn Sawicki captured 2 7&U [Short Course records](#), Ava Curry garnered 4 7&U, while Amanda Wang picked up one of her own. Amanda Wang and Ava Curry picked up where they left off in the spring as 7yr-olds, setting records in the 8&U group this past fall. Laurel Carey burned through 11 SC records over two months this past fall in the 9-10's. Aidan Pinto swiped 2 of her own. On the boys side in Short Course, Liam Hughes captured 5 6&U records, Nicolas Taboada set a record in 8&U and Roo Fenton, Vinny Marciano & Adrian Massuet sliced through 16 of the 9-10 records.
